Death is a democracy. It comes equally to us all and makes all of us equal. As Longfellow said:

> "Art is long, and time is fleeting, and our hearts, though stout and brave, Still, like muffled drums, are beating Funeral marches to the grave."

Occasionally you will find someone who remarks in the spirit of Thoreau, "I'm not interested in questions on immortality. One world at a time...that's my motto. Do the duty that lies close at hand and don't worry about the hereafter." But this skirts the problem, for what a man believes about the hereafter will effect the way he lives here. During the Korean struggle, the Fifth Company of Marines was compelled, with eighteen thousand men, to fight against more than a hundred thousand Chinese Communist. Marguerite Higgins, the Pulitzer prize winner, reported:

It was particularly cold...42 degrees below zero... that morning when reporters were standing around. The weary soldiers, half frozen, stood by their dirty trucks eating from tins cans. A huge marine was eating cold beans with his trench knife. His clothes were as stiff as a board. His face, covered with heavy beard, was crusted with mud. A correspondent asked him, "If I were God and could grant you anything you wished, what would you most like?" 'The man stood notionless for a moment. Then he raised his head and replied, "Give me tomorrow.

The key to tomorrow belongs to Jesus. After demonstrating His power over death, He declared, "I am he that liveth, and was dead; and behold, I am alive for ever more, Amen; and have the keys of hell and of death" (Revelation 1:18). Triumphant in victory, He promised "Whosover liveth and believeth in me shall never die." Jesus, alone, is able to give us tomorrow.'
