Running to the Goal

Back when I was in high school in Crossett, AR., I was on the track team. One of my events was the 400 meters. It was called the 440 yard dash back then, which seems like a hundred years ago. The 400 meter is a difficult race. It is a distance race that you have to run like a sprint. You leave the blocks as fast as you can, hit your stride as early as you can and hold it all of the way. And if you have anything left when you hit the tape, 2 you should have used it in the race. That's the way to run this race and win.

In writing to Christians the apostle Paul said, "Do you not know that in a race all the runners compete, but only one receives the prize? So run that you may obtain it." The words, "So run," carry a great weight of meaning. Picture the eager runner. See how he strains every muscle. Look at him as he pants at the finish line. That's the way to run. And if we as Christians would work half as hard as winning athletes, there would be fewer stunted and halfdead Christians among us.

Think for a moment about the difference between the prize that stirs the racer's energies and the prize we are pursuing. "They do it to receive a perishable wreath." In the ancient games the winner received a twist of pine branch out of a neighboring grove. It certainly wasn't worth much . But a Christian runs to receive "an imperishable" crown. No one can begin to judge its ultimate worth.

The victorious runner sets an example of rigid-self control. He trains, watches his diet, takes care his body, and submits to discipline. It's absolutely essential to victory. Nor is it any different for Christians! One can't do as he pleases and go to heaven. Rigid self-control and abstinence from even legitimate things will be necessary.

One more thing. The apostle Paul said, "I do not run aimlessly." There must be no stopping, no turning aside to pick up a golden apple, no careless loops made on the track, or one will be left hopelessly behind. Few things are more needed today than resolve, conscious concentration upon an aim which is clearly before us.

There's something to be said for keeping one's eye on the goal. To go just anywhere is the certain way to arrive nowhere.
